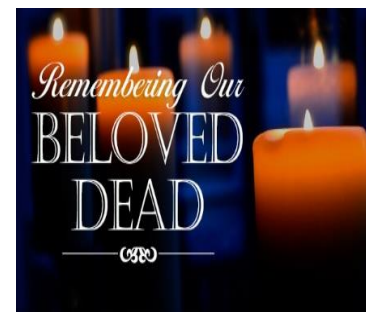

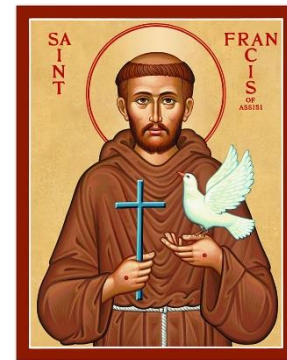

NOVEMBER A TIME TO REMEMBER Throughout November at every Mass and on the First Friday's of every month we remember and pray for the repose of the souls of all the Faithful Departed.

Today 11th November 2018 marks 100 years since the ending of World War I. The horror of the Great War shattered whatever illusion people or nations had of war – it was never again to happen! Yet still a centenary later our world or rather those most powerful who govern it fail to adhere to *never again!* We remember and we pray in the words attributed to St. Francis, himself a soldier veteran of war.....



Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.
