THE RIGHT TO LIFE.

During these weeks ahead, much reflection and debate continues in the public and political sphere. It is important that in private, at home, within the family and our circle of friends that discussion also takes place. Conscious that this may bring to the fore a lot of pain for those who may have personal experience of abortion, be assured of God's compassion and our prayerful support.

Life is sacred; life is precious. For us as believers all life comes from God. "God loved the world so much that he gave us his only Son". We who profess the Christian Faith know how His message of life was rejected by many, how the world did not accept his way. Yet his love was unconditional, even to accepting the Cross. Rising from the dead Christ Jesus proves how God works beyond what we may think possible and even through the most adverse of circumstances. We also have the example of Mary and Joseph; of the men and women of the Bible, of the Saints of our Church to inspire and guide us in our time as we cope with the joys and the sorrows of our personal lives, of our families, of our local community and of our country and world in general.

Within the context of our civil responsibilities and our personal devotion and participation as followers of Christ in the Catholic Church, let us never be afraid to give witness to the dignity of the human person from conception to death. Some people face unimaginable situations in life: they deserve our love and sympathy; many deserve justice for unspeakable crimes. No woman or girl should ever feel alone when pregnant; should never be overcome with anxiety or despair; should never feel abandoned. Very often indeed the circumstances of pregnancy are complicated but the child growing in the womb never deserves abortion. Please believe that life, every life, matters. Abortion kills not only a baby, it wipes out the possibilities, the 'what ifs' of a future and as a consequence another generation to come. Look at some of the amazing people of the past and the present in the area of music and the arts, in the academics and sciences, in sports and politics, these people's lives have enriched our world and their achievements admired; and yet their backgrounds emerged from far from ideal beginnings and they testify that if they had been aborted society would be at a loss. Look at our own families and communities, how enriched and challenged we are by children and adults with special needs; how much less love would we have if abortion had been chosen? For sure lack of compassion, casting judgement upon people and so much more inexcusable things have hurt and left lingering pain. Yet so many families did not reject and instead accepted the initial unwanted pregnancy and they tell stories of how the baby was born and enhanced the whole family dynamic. It takes unconditional love and always self-sacrifices for the whole family and for a local community too but together with the mother and child all things are possible.

Your vote counts; your voice must be heard. Through us the voice of the child in the womb is heard, we vote for the unborn! Consider carefully what is being asked of us. Pray, reflect and discuss with others. How women were treated and what was done in the past 'in the name of Christ' by many in the home, in the parish and in religious schools and institutions was sadly, regrettably, shamefully unchristian and wrong. Even today and in the future human beings who claim to be Catholic or Christian still don't always act as they should in the name of Christ. However, such facts must not cloud the truth that *life is sacred*, even amid the most trying of situations a mother or a father may find themselves facing as they cope with the miracle of life and pregnancy. Together we must support, love and pray for all who are with child and enable those who struggle to seek guidance and comfort. There are so many options and abortion doesn't have to be one of them. Chose life.
