THE ICON OF THE HOLY FAMILY As part of our parish on-going preparations for the World Meeting of Families, two Icons of the Holy Family are available from one Sunday to the next, over the months until the visit of Pope Francis in August, for families to take for a week and perhaps invite their extended families or neighbours round to their home for a celebration of the rosary and refreshments. Individual pilgrims and families can now register for the main three-day WMOF2018 Congress from August 22nd – 24th, for the Festival of Families on Saturday 25th August; and for the Closing Mass on Sunday, 26th August.
