

EXTRAORDINARY MONTH OF MISSION 2019

The Rosary as a Mission Prayer during this October: Begin with kissing the cross on your rosary beads and blessing yourself. From the cross use the rosary beads as follows. With the first bead, say an Our Father and then on the next three beads say three Hail Marys and with the next bead say a Glory Be – these first five prayers are for the Holy Father, Pope

Francis' intentions. Then proceed to the right of the chain of rosary beads. Start at the image of Mary and recite a decade of prayers in this way, one Our Father, ten Hail Marys, one Glory Be. (the large bead is used for the Our Father & Glory Be). For this month of Mission reflect during each decade on these five intentions; 1 Pray for all the people of Africa and all the missionaries who live there, that their work may be helpful to everyone and we pray for an end to all fighting and that the baptised may grow in grace; 2 Pray for all the people in the Americas and all the missionaries living there, may we all try to find a new way each day to help others and show that we love all people; 3 Pray for all the people in *Europe* and all the missionaries who live here, that Christians in our continent may remain true to Jesus and continue to share His word; 4 Pray for the people in *Oceania* and all the missionaries living there, remembering too all the Christians around the globe, especially those who live in remote places; 5 Pray for the people in *Asia* and all the missionaries living there, let us also pray for peace and that we may never forget about the poor in our world. Conclude this Mission Rosary with a silent moment with Our Lady and then say this prayer which Pope Francis has asked us to say during this extraordinary Month of Mission:

Heavenly Father, when your only begotten Son Jesus Christ rose from the dead, he commissioned his followers to 'go and make disciples of all nations' and you remind us that through our Baptism we are made sharers in the mission of the Church. Empower us by the gifts of the Holy Spirit to be courageous and zealous in bearing witness to the Gospel, so that the mission entrusted to the Church, which is still very far from completion, may find new and efficacious expressions that bring life and light to the world. Help us make it possible for all peoples to experience the saving love and mercy of Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, One God, forever and ever. Amen.
